As part of our work on health we are exploring the potential of faith communities as a 'setting' for improving public health, including for tackling issues of domestic violence and abuse (DVA) and FGM. We are currently undertaking a project focused on how faith leaders have responded once they have become aware of domestic violence occurring in their congregations, and developing training materials to equip other leaders to deal with the issues. Below are just a few examples from individual faith groups talking about how they are addressing DVA and FGM.

Kahrmel Wellness

Karhmel Wellness is a charity dedicated to helping adult and child survivors of DVA to rebuild and restore their lives. We host regular conferences for faith leaders and professionals from local government, health and other services, at which we teach and train on FGM. This is facilitated by a specialist midwife. In addition we interwork with our local midwifery services that help victims of FGM. We receive referrals as well as give consultation on cases they receive, as many of them have the co-existence of FGM and DVA. FGM is a type of DVA, and other forms of DVA can be subtypes of abuse in FGM cases. For example, a pregnant woman who has been mutilated might also be a victim of forced marriage and sexual abuse. When the baby is born her husband might expect her to be 're-stitched' the FGM way.

Oxford Pastors Forum

Bishop-Elect Memory Tapfumaneyi is the Pastor of NLCC (New Life Covenant Church Oxford). He started the Oxford Pastors Forum which has been raising awareness on DVA, child abuse and FGM in Oxford. He works with the Bishop of Oxford in a variety of community projects as well as with multi-faith leaders, and is on the Strategic Advisory Board of Thames Valley Police.

The Oxford Pastors Forum hosted a major event in October 2014 for raising awareness of DVA, child abuse and FGM. They are also driving for church leaders to work with statutory services, and they are developing a community safeguarding hub where faith leaders will have regular communication with the community.

As well raising awareness regarding FGM, the Forum is also advising on how to tackle the problem. It works in conjunction with a local doctor to achieve this.
