# PREVENTING CHILD SEXUAL EXPLOITATION

## Introduction

- Since the Independent Inquiry into Child Sexual Exploitation in Rotherham, all local authorities have been forced to sit up and listen!!
- Telford & Wrekin's Young People's Scrutiny Committee undertook a review on CSE in November 2014
- Terms of reference 'How well are organisations in Telford & Wrekin working together to prevent CSE, protect and support the victims and their families and prosecute perpetrators'

## Introduction

- Conclusions of the Scrutiny Committee's Report were:-
- That the Committee were reassured by the level of commitment from all the organisations that participated in the review.
- The Committee concluded that, based on the evidence presented, organisations in Telford & Wrekin were working well together to respond to known cases of CSE.

# CSE – Telford & Wrekin's approach

Why do we issue licences?

- Paramount consideration is PUBLIC SAFETY.
- We have a duty to ensure drivers are 'fit & proper' to hold a licence.

- What are the checks we undertake?
- 1. Enhanced Disclosure & Barring Service Checks (DBS)
- 2. DVLA Mandate Checks
- 3. Group 2 Medical Checks

THESE CHECKS ARE GENERALLY STANDARD THROUGHOUT ALL LOCAL AUTHORITIES IN ENGLAND & WALES.

 Telford & Wrekin Council also undertakes two additional checks:-

- 1. Driving Standards Assessment
- 2. Driver Awareness Training (which incorporates a Street Knowledge Test)

 As a result, since August 2015, Telford & Wrekin Council's licensing department has revised its current Street Knowledge Test.

- Now incorporate a strong emphasis on CSE.
- Encourage drivers to 'say something if you see something'

 Many licensing authorities have provided mandatory 'one-off' training sessions for drivers to attend.

- Telford & Wrekin Council has currently undertaken a consultation exercise on its 'Hackney Carriage & Private Hire Policy and Conditions'
- CSE Training will become mandatory

- Driver Awareness Training now includes a short video to highlight CSE issues (Telford & Wrekin has used Barnado's resource toolkit as a point of reference)
- Questions are now incorporated into our Knowledge Test specifically on CSE issues.
- 20 questions are centred around our existing conditions of licence.
- 5 questions on CSE issues.

If applicants do not answer 4 of the 5
questions on CSE correctly, they fail!! (even if
the applicant passes all other parts of the
Test!).

- Key elements that our training concentrates on:-
- What are the signs to look out for. Emphasis on:-
- Taking/collecting young people (girls and boys) from hotels/B&B's/house parties
- Picking up young people from other cars
- Young people who look distressed or intimidated
- Observing suspicious activity in hot-spot areas
- Young people under the influence of drugs and/or alcohol
- Attempts by young women to avoid paying fares in return for sexual favours
- Regular males requesting taxi rides to and from locations taking young people with them
- Taking young people to A&E, who are not in the presence of parents
- Young people with injuries such as bruising or blood stains

#### What should drivers to with that information?

- Make notes about the information you know
- Call the police non-emergency number 101 to report your concerns about possible sexual exploitation, or report the matter to the Licensing Team.

#### What information should they share?

- Names
- Locations and addresses of concerns
- Descriptions of people
- Car registration plates, makes and models of vehicles
- Description of concerning activity

 Telford & Wrekin Council currently has 260 licensed drivers.

70% of Asian origin

18% White British

7% Other White Background (predominantly Eastern European)

5% African and Caribbean

Heavy emphasis is placed on regularly sharing
 CSE information with all drivers at:-

- Renewal appointments (CSE literature given to all drivers)
- By Email (CSE information given to all Private Hire Operators to display at their bases).
- By Text (routinely sent to drivers reminding them how to report CSE matters).

- Considerable amount of effort has been given towards 'breaking down barriers'.
- Drivers often fearful or reporting matters direct to West Mercia Police and Crimestoppers.
- Drivers often want anonymity!!! Certain elements of the community are afraid to 'grass on other drivers!!'. The Licensing Department encourages drivers to share any CSE matters. Assurances given that their identity withheld.

### The Way Forward

- More drivers are expected to apply for licences. Conservative estimate will see an additional 150 applicants over the next year!
- CSE is too important to ignore! we need to ensure that we continue to engage with our licensees and highlight matters surrounding CSE.

# The Way Forward

- CSE literature now required to be displayed at our Private Hire Operator Bases.
- Not just for licensed drivers to see, but also for those who take the calls.
- We are going to ensure that operators have a designated CSE contact for drivers to report concerns confidentially.

# The Way Forward

- Telford & Wrekin are currently working with partner agencies to conveying the importance of CSE to our late-night refreshment houses.
- Several dates planned where CSE literature to be distributed to restaurants/late-night takeaways.
- CSE launch event to these premises on 1<sup>st</sup> December 2016.
