Making integration happen – this includes a range of resources and workshops to support leaders to progress integration ambitions around key enablers, including identifying the benefits of integration in terms of financial or quality improvements; developing a local care model; understanding systems finances; developing effective partnership governance; and systems to measure impact.

Public health

The transfer of public health is one of the most significant extensions of local government powers and duties in a generation. It is a unique opportunity to change the focus from treating sickness to actively promoting prevention, health and wellbeing.

Our support offer for developing innovative, efficient and sustainable approaches in care and health includes a range of tools, with a focus on self-assessment:

- A toolkit to enable councils to assess to what extent they are the best use of their resources and promoting personalisation in a challenging environment.
- The adult social care risk awareness tool supports health and care system leaders in targeting limited resources on the right issues in social care and identifying mitigating action to address their most pressing risks.
- In addition to the risk tool, leaders in social care can access a free workshop of up to one and a half days to undertake the self-assessment exercise with skilled and experienced facilitators in a confidential and peer-supported environment with partners if appropriate. Focused peer challenges

These challenges, which include adult safeguarding, adult social care and other more specialised areas such as commissioning for better outcomes, Use of Resources and Mental Capacity Act (MCA) including Deprivation of Liberty Safeguards (DoLS) are focused on driving improvement. Each chargeable challenge will focus on issues identified in discussion with the local authority and utilise highly-experienced peers in the relevant services areas.
