#### What were the achievements

Staff well being

PIFU and self booking



#### What were the outcomes?

572 people seen in 2 days

50% PIFU pathway

30% conversation or intervention with Community services

10% return from PIFU at 6/12 point

CollaboRate score 11.1

4-5 weeks off the waiting list
