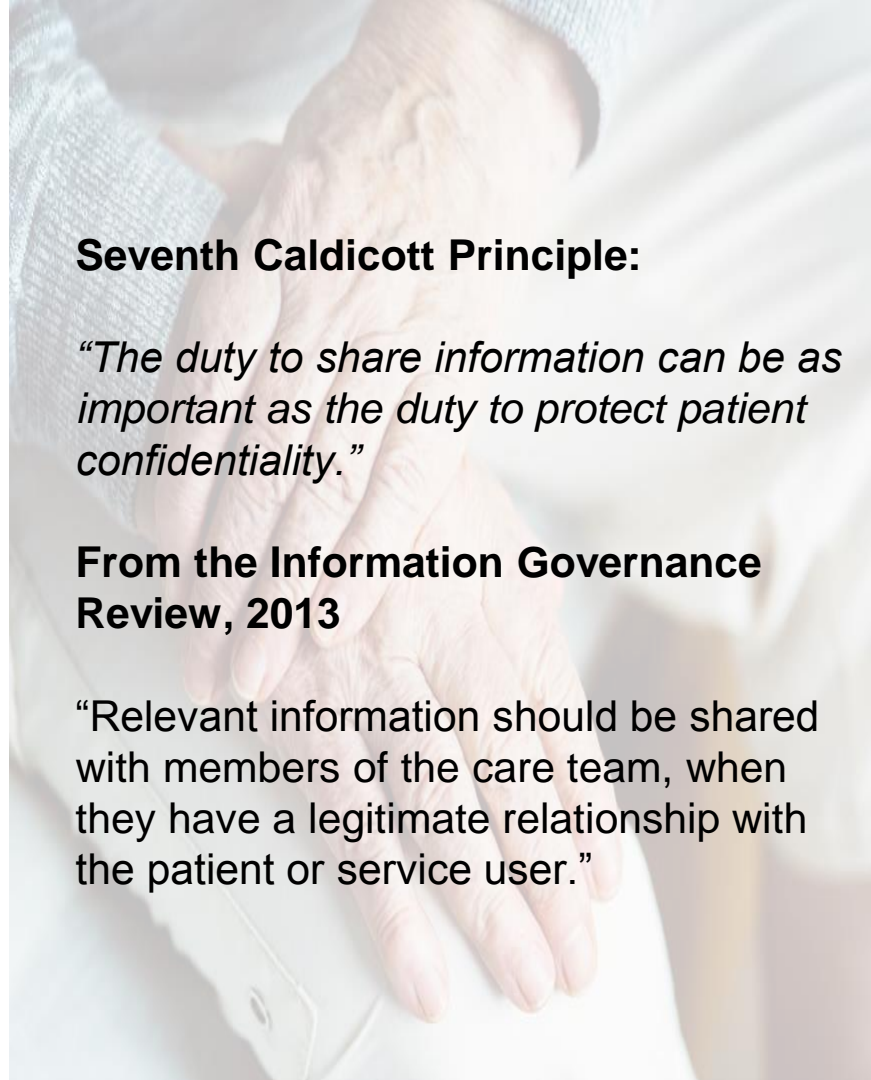
Context – why information sharing?

“The duty to share information can be as important as the duty to protect patient confidentiality.”

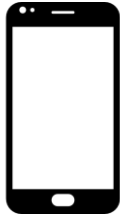

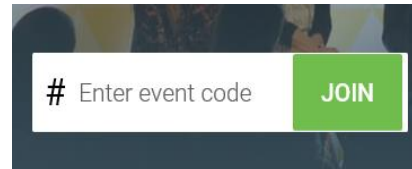
