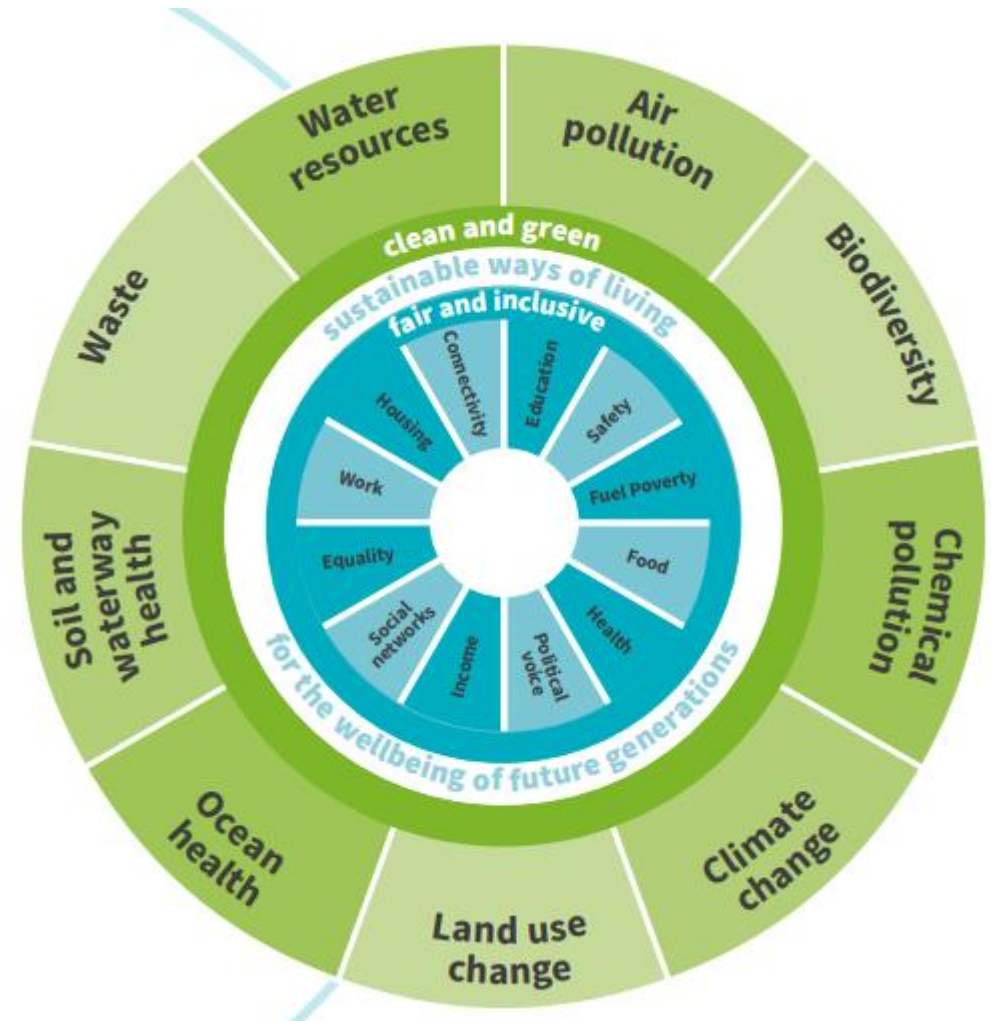

# Background

- Duty to undertake Equality Impact Assessments (EIAs)
- Evolved to become 'Comprehensive Impact Assessment'
- Climate Emergency Declaration 2019
- Widened assessments to take doughnut economic approach to equality, environmental, carbon and social impacts of policies, decisions and projects.
- Also includes Cornwall specific impacts and issues e.g. rurality, renewables



# How it works

- Two wheels – Environmental and Social; Equality and Inclusion
- Each segment has a set of questions
- Assess mitigated impact
- Each segment colour coded according to impact
- Council officers use it as part of project development – can change through life of a project
- Peer reviewed
- Decision makers presented with wheels at point of decision
- Public domain

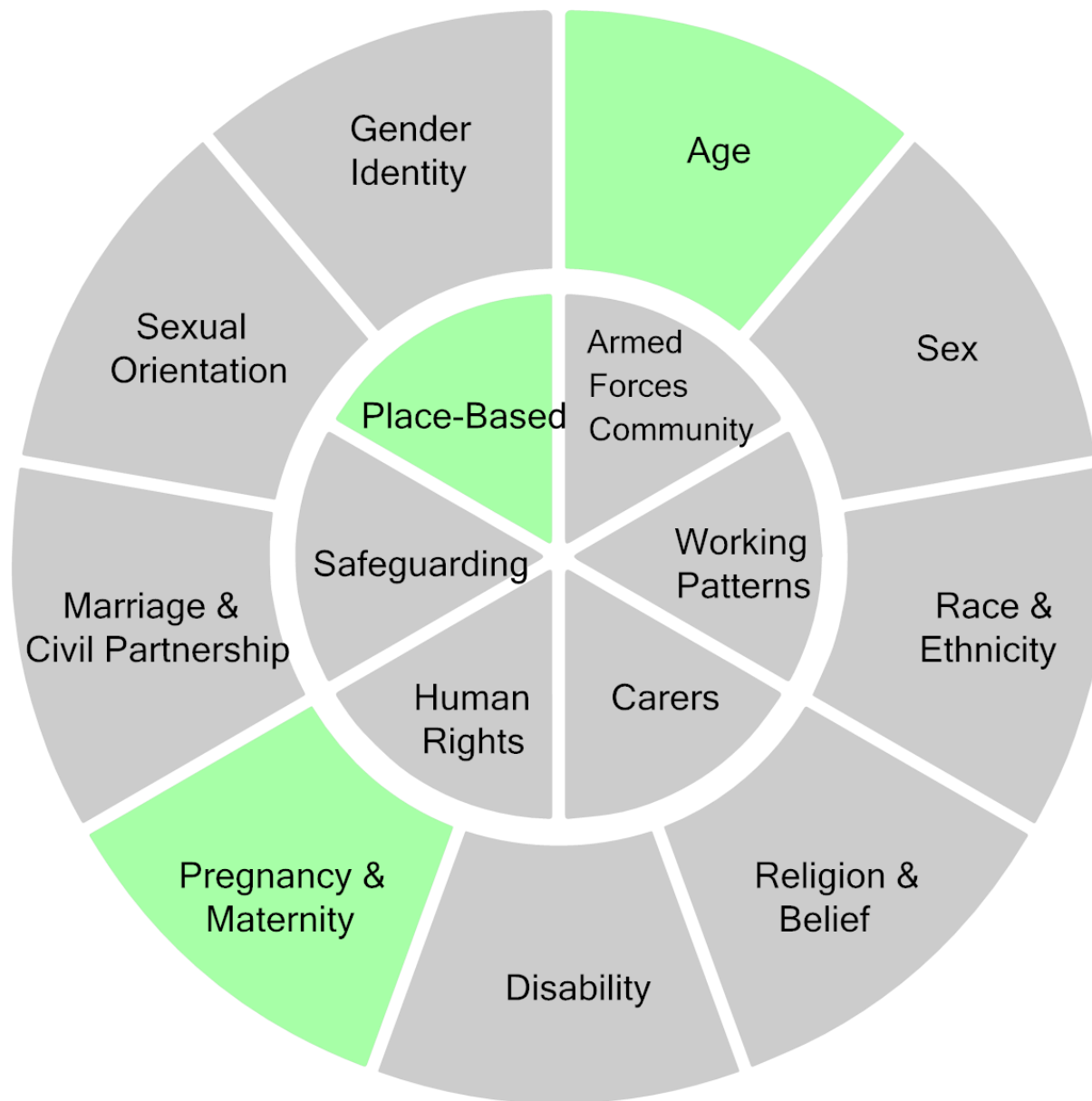
