


Skills & Qualifications

Degree or higher level (Level 4 or above) Bristol 42.1 (E&W 33.8%)

67% Redland ward compared to 15.8% in Hartcliffe and Withywood ward

No qualifications Bristol 14.5% (E&W 18.2%)

There are two wards in Bristol where more than a quarter of people aged 16 and over have no qualifications - Hartcliffe and Withywood 30.4% and Filwood 28.2

- NHS Section 256 Healthier Together Funding
- Targeting residents 16+ facing greatest barriers to good quality careers
- Managed by Bristol City Council Employment, Skills and Learning Service
- Multi-agency steering group with lead employers and commissioners NHS, Adult and Children's Social Care
- Working together with local employers, training providers, schools/colleges and community organisations







995 experiences of work have been delivered within health and social care for young people from priority groups

- Cabot Learning Federation Raising Aspirations event for all Year
 9 learners during National Careers Week
- ✓ Careers day and in house-work experience programme
- Targeted workshops including curriculum support for risk of NEET Group
- ✓ Mentoring project for girls
- ✓ Work experience tasters for young people with SEND

18 work experience placements and tasters - BCC educational psychology and occupational therapy team

Additional support offered to NHS recruiters – content creation and review, resource and process support for work experience

COMMUNITY LEARNING



110 adult learners have engaged with courses aimed at working within the Health and Social Care Sector

Varied courses – different starting points:

- ✓ Preparing to work in Childcare
- ✓ Introduction to H&SC
- ✓ ESOL for the NHS
- ✓ Advocacy L2
- ✓ First Aid courses

31 learners have progressed onto accredited level 1 courses in: Health and Social Care or Child Care. 81% pass rate (25 learners)



Career Coach & Navigator support

- ✓ Working with employers to job carve
- ✓ Helping match individual job seekers to vacancies
- ✓ Career coach details on job adverts
- ✓ Supporting individuals to complete job applications and prepare for interviews

The Employment Support team engaged with over 80 people with 11 signing up to projects on the day

Seminars were hosted in our city centre Launchpad

- o Apprenticeships in Health and Social Care
- Health and Social Care Entry level roles

The Launchpad was also used as a **quiet area** for private conversations/interviews throughout the day



Continuing to work with NHS and partners on our test and learn pilot

Plugging this into our ICP workforce development strategy and with commissioners, employers and suppliers to build diverse talent pathways

Joint planning with our Combined Authority and neighbouring local authorities on a sustainable inclusive career pathway model

Opportunities to integrate this targeted approach with other funding streams and programmes – e.g. WorkWell Partnership Programme and Universal Support
