New research and statistics

Employment, pay and workforce:

LGA Statistical Alert:

The September 2019 Statistical Alert produced by LGA Research and Information shows Consumer Price Index including owner occupiers housing costs (CPIH) decreased to 1.7 per cent in August 2019 from 2.0 per cent in July 2019. Retail Price Index (RPI) annual inflation decreased to 2.6 per cent in August 2019 from 2.8 per cent in July 2019.

The number of people in employment in Great Britain was 31,907,000 for the three months to July 2019; this has increased by 25,000 compared to the previous quarter. Unemployment in Great Britain for the same periods was 1,268,000 for the quarter to July 2019, a decrease of 8,000 from 1,276,000 in the previous quarter.

Figures provided by XpertHR, an online resource for employment law HR good practice and benchmarking, showed the median whole economy pay settlement level of 2.5 per cent to the three months ending August 2019, a decrease from 2.6 per cent in July 2019.

Results from the Labour Research Department (LRD) survey provided by XpertHR showed the median level of union-negotiated awards for the whole economy was 2.9 per cent for the three months ending August 2019, a fall from 3.0 per cent in July 2019.

The Make UK (formerly Engineering Employers Federation) mean for manufacturing remained at 2.6 per cent in the three months ending July 2019.

Youth offending – 2018/19, England

The number of first time entrants to the Youth Justice System aged 10-17 was 11,374 in 2018/19 in England, this compares to 75,270 for 2008/09. This is the number of first time entrants to the criminal justice system where first time entrants are defined as young people (aged 10-17) who receive their first substantive outcome (relating to a reprimand, a final warning with or without an intervention, or a court disposal for those who go directly to court without a reprimand or final warning).

Council tax levels set by local authorities – 2019/20, England

In England the average council tax band D tax bill, the total amount paid by the residents in the billing authority, has increased from £1,671 in 2018/19 to £1,750 in 2019/20. This represents the total band D council tax requirement that residents in the local billing authority area would pay. Band D has historically been used as the standard for comparing council tax levels between and across local authorities, as this measure is not affected by the varying distribution of properties in bands that can be found across authorities.

End of life care profiles – 2018, England

There were 10.1 Care home beds per 100 people aged 75+ on the 31st March 2018, a fall from 10.3 per 100 on 31st March 2017. This is the number of beds in care homes (nursing and residential) as reported by Care Quality Commission (CQC) per 100 people aged 75 and over. Includes both private and public care institutions
