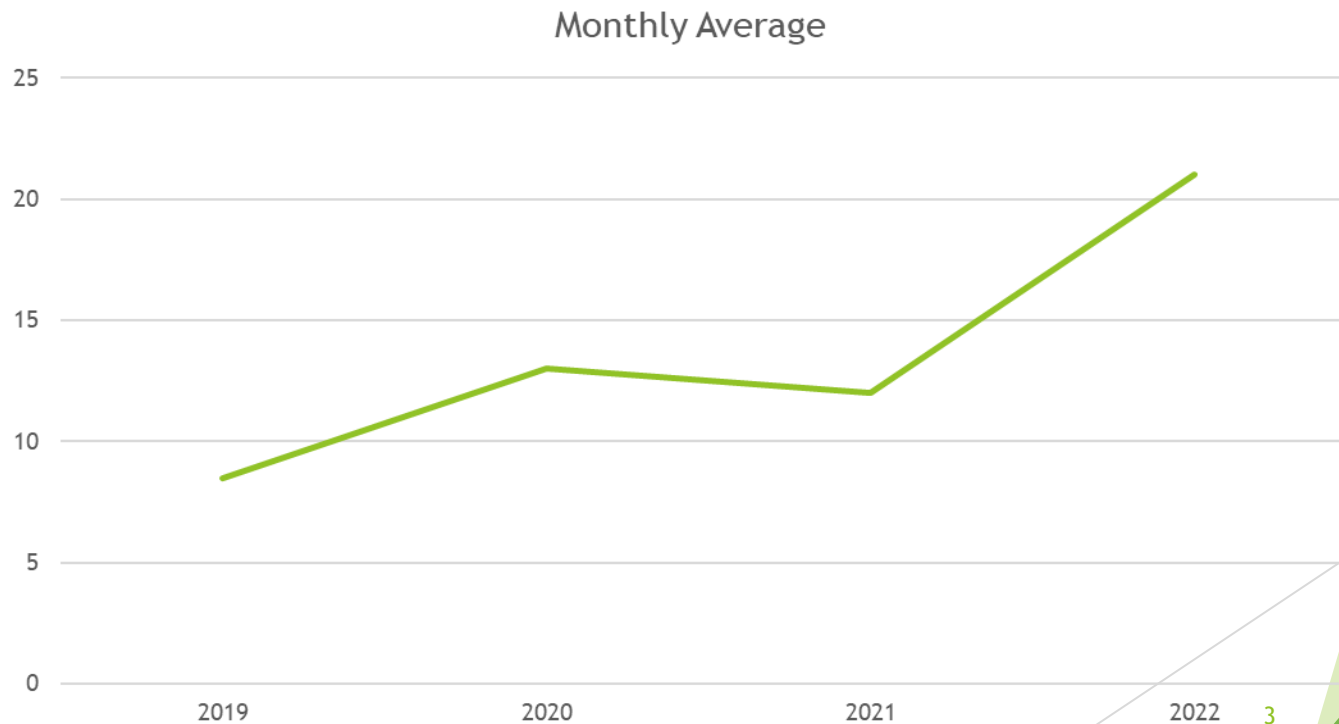
# Referral Numbers

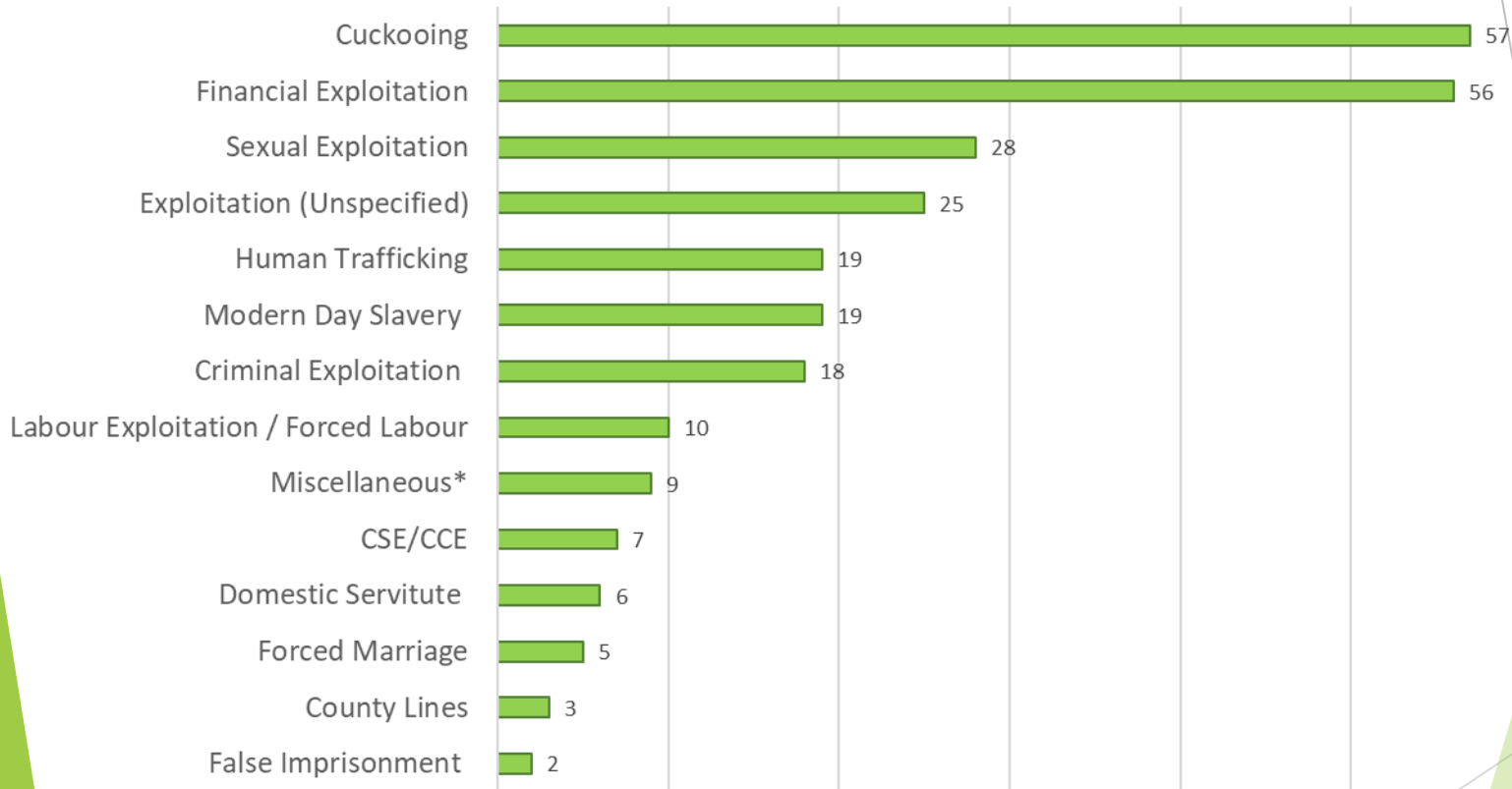

Mental Health Issues (Diagnosed and Symptoms)	73

Total of 571 vulnerabilities identified between July 2021 and July 2022.  
Average number of vulnerabilities per case is 3.6. 18 had only 1, 72 had 4 or more, and 29 had 6 or more  
Most common vulnerabilities are: Unemployment, Homelessness, Substance Use, and Mental Health Issues.
