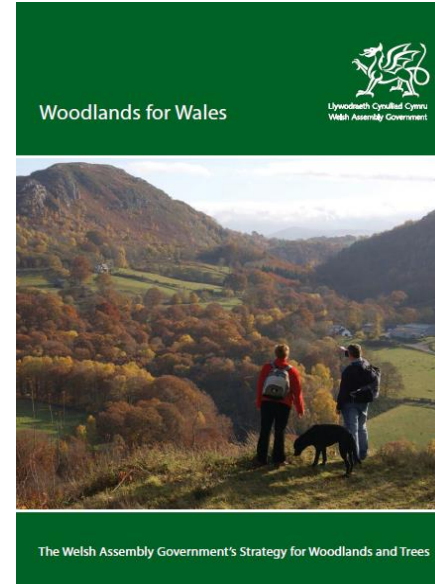
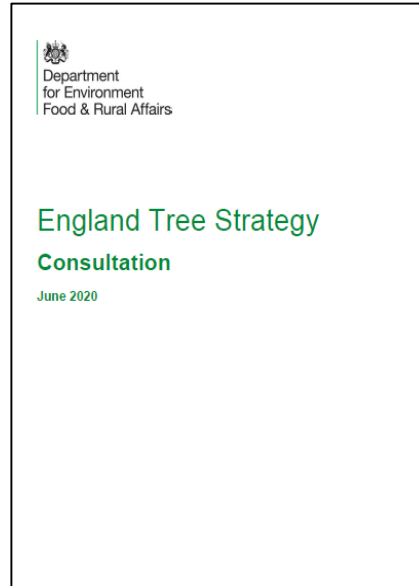

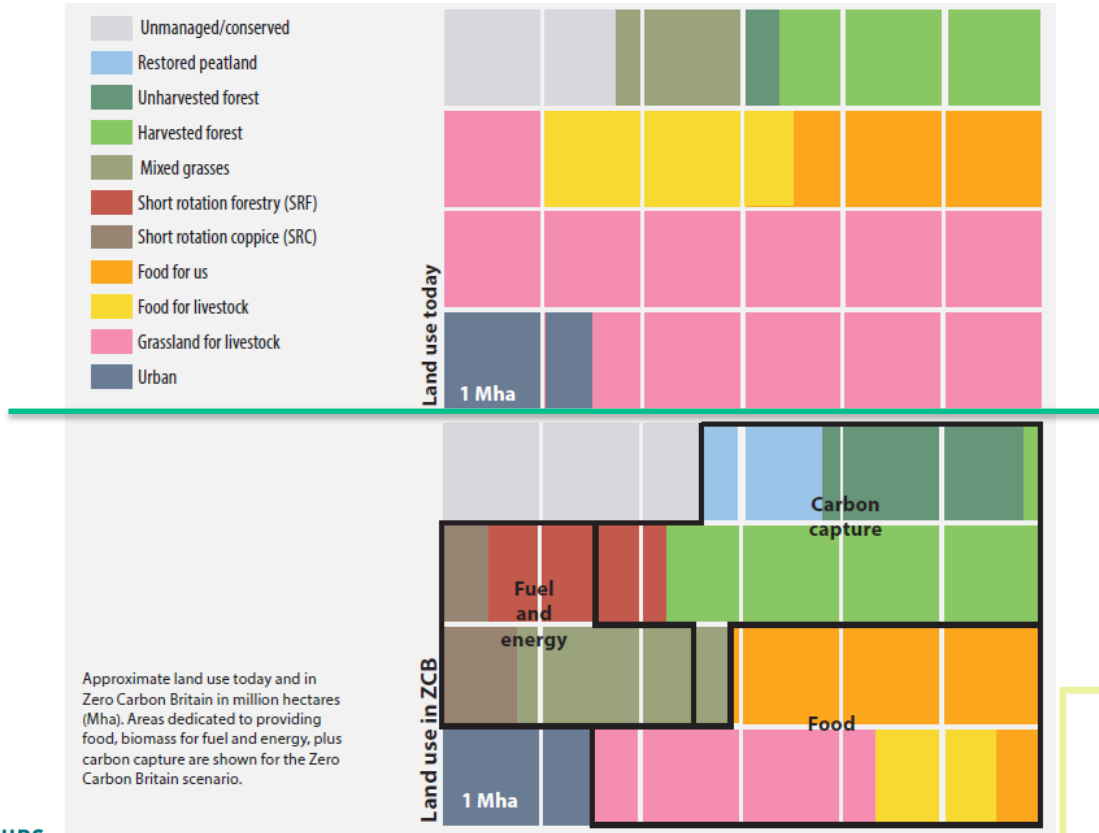
STRATEGIC CONTEXT

UK Government manifesto pledge = 30,000ha of new woodland per year by 2025 (total for UK).



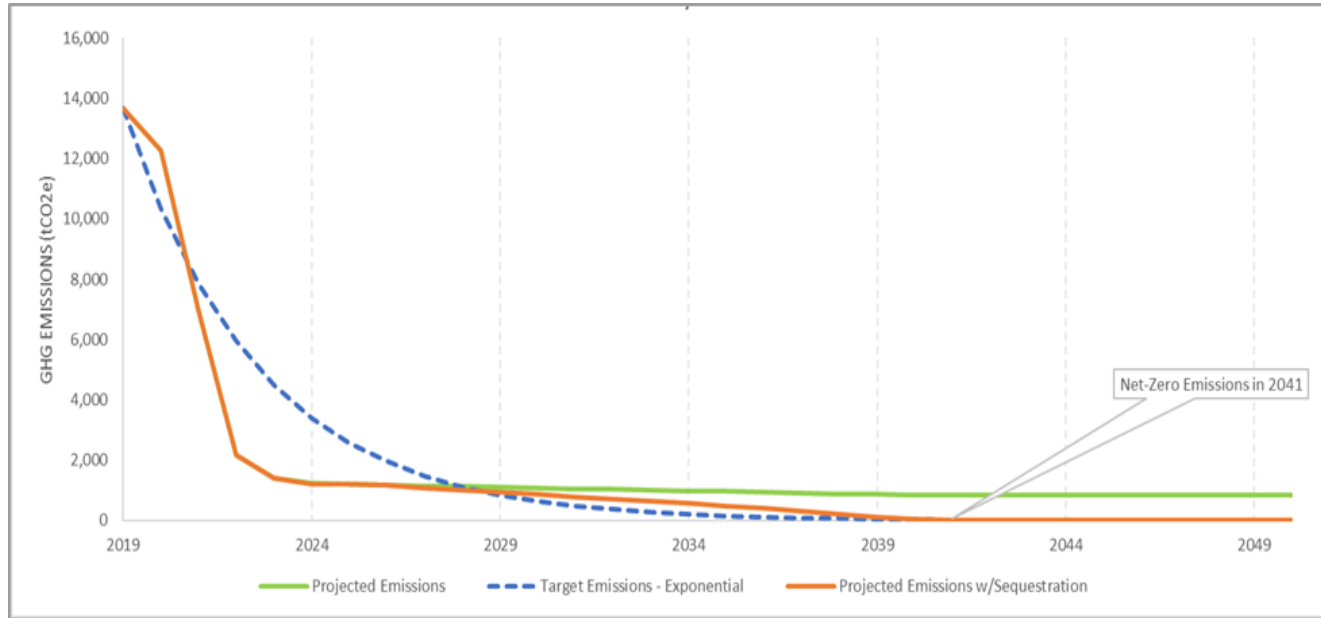
LAND USE CHANGE FOR ZERO CARBON BRITAIN

KEY CONSIDERATIONS

Partnership approach

We propose to explore how mapping, and local partnerships and strategies, can identify the best and most appropriate areas for new trees and woodland..... This work should be at a landscape-scale which considers woodland creation alongside wider objectives.; such as supporting the rural economy, recovering nature, and improving the quality of landscapes.

Woodland type will depend on availability of land, site characteristics and key objectives

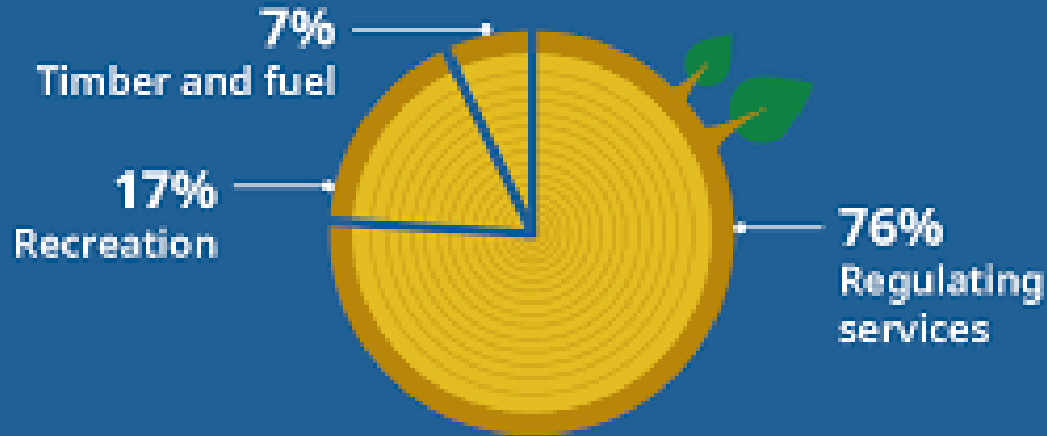
Woodland creation strategy aligned to local and regional priorities
